The Special Arrangements for the Lenten Services will be found below, and I would most earnestly invite the readers of our Magazine to make all the use they can of them. Lent is intended to awaken us to a deeper sense of our sinfulness and God's mercy; to arouse us to greater acts of self-denial; and to lift us to a higher spiritual level. "Lent" means "Spring," and it comes when all nature is awaking to new life and new beauty and new usefulness. And every Lent should mark a new departure in our moral and spiritual growth.

So I would say, as a means to this, come to the services regularly. Use all your influence to induce others to come as well. Come to the Holy Communion in obedience to the Saviour's command. Look into your own life; repair the defects; strengthen the weak points; and further develope the strong ones. The Christian, who really wishes to profit by the season, is likely to reason thus with himself: "Growth and strength of body come by food and exercise. It is the same with the soul. I wish to 'grow in grace' and to be 'strong in the Lord.' So I will seek all the spiritual nourishment I can obtain, and exercise myself in 'whatsoever things are of good report. I will make more use of my Church; of my Bible; of private prayer; of my means; of my influence over others. I will try to be a better Christian; a better member of my family; a better friend; a better member of society. And I will make a fresh beginning in all these things,

Such a resolution, honestly made, could not fail in its effect, but would cause this Lent to mark a distinct step upward and heavenward.
