My dear Friends,

The St. James' Festival School Treat was, I think, one of the brightest we have had for some time. The weather was everything that could be desired. Five hundred and twenty children assembled at the Schools, and, with the Day and Sunday School Teachers, marched in procession, preceded by the Band, to the Church. After a short service the ranks were re-formed, and in excellent order the children marched to their positions for Tea in the Vicarage Grounds. After each had received a Jubilee Medal (which it is hoped will long be retained in memory of the lengthy reign of our noble Queen), Tea was commenced, and marvellous was the consumption of bread and butter, cakes and buns. A very large number of parents of the children and members of the congregation came in later, and the scene was most animated and picturesque when the various amusements, such as races, "Bell in the Ring," "Bobbing for Sugar Plums," Cocoanut Shies, Punch and Judy, &c., were in full swing. Judging from the number of perambulators present we are not likely to lack supporters on such occasions for many a long year to come.

As will be seen from the list appended below, the contributions to the Treats' Fund have been generous and ample. Most of them were most kindly collected by Miss Barnard. Gifts of toys, dolls, sweets, cakes, &c., were received from Mrs. FitzWygram, Mr. Howe, Major Balguy, Mr. Prewett, Mr. Matthews, Mrs. J. Singleton, Mr. Moles, Misses Stephenson, Mrs. Rixen, Mrs. Stanton, and others. Valuable services were rendered by Messrs. Singleton and Sons, Mr. Dowsett, Mr. Hallt, Mr. E. Singleton, as well as by all the Teachers. The Day Schools will be closed until Monday, the 23rd inst., when I hope the parents will do their best to see that every child is present if possible.

During the holidays the morning Sunday School will continue as usual, but there will be no Sunday Afternoon School. We shall, however, be very glad to see the children at the Sunday Afternoon Service at 3.15.

The subscriptions for the Day Schools are now due, and the lady collectors will wait upon the subscribers without delay. Every year, in the natural course of things, some subscriptions drop out, and unless new ones were to take their place the Schools would soon suffer. Those who are not at present supporters of the Schools are earnestly invited to become so before the end of September. Subscriptions will be thankfully received by Mrs. FitzWygram, Mrs. Hodge, Miss Barnard, and myself.

The Annual Tea in connection with the Communicants' Association will take place on or about the 23rd inst. Due notice will be given to members.

We have all been saddened by the removal from amongst us of Miss Edith Mann, who was a most regular teacher in the Sunday School, and whose young, bright, unselfish life, closed after a short, severe illness on the 19th ult. She will be sorely missed by all who knew her. The deepest sympathy will be felt for those to whom she was nearest and dearest.
