My DEAR FRIENDS,

The Balance Sheet for the Day Schools will be found below, from which it will be seen that the expenditure has been large, larger indeed than in any previous year. Fortunately the Managers have had a larger amount of money to deal with, and they have been able to make considerable additions to the furniture of the Schools, and to promote the comfort and convenience of the teaching staff. It will be noticed that there is a balance on the wrong side, but that is not excessive, and it is hoped that with the extra help promised by the Water Companies, notwithstanding the heavy expenditure before us, the adverse balance will soon disappear. I am glad to say that in addition to the subscriptions promised by the Water Companies and mentioned last month, the "Southwark and Vauxhall" Company have promised to increase their subscription from £5 5s. to £15.

Her Majesty's Inspector, on his recent visit to the Schools, suggested the formation of an advanced Class in both the Boys' and Girls' departments, for helping forward the sharp children. This is a new departure, and is likely to be of great benefit to children who wish to "get on."

The Conversazione on the 14th was thoroughly well patronized, the room being crowded. A large number of ladies dispensed the tea, and help was given towards the Entertainment by Miss Cremer, Miss Geraldine Cooke, Miss Davies, Miss Storey, Mrs. Job and the Vicarage boys, Messrs. Vine Griffiths, F. W. Dawkins, E. Singleton, Sherwood, and the Rev. E. S. Phillips. We were also very much indebted to Mr. Bridger for his help with his lantern, and to Mr. Dowsett for taking charge of the door. The proceeds, after

the payment of all expenses, left a balance of £2 os. od., which will be handed over to the Curate's Fund.

The Provident Club has done another year's good work under the fostering care of the District Visitors. The re-payments will be made on Friday morning, the 9th inst., at 11 punctually, at the Mission Room. The amount to be re-paid is upwards of £460.

The next of the Winter Entertainments will be on the 5th inst. A large attendance is expected. Very great pains are being bestowed upon the programme, and an enjoyable evening may be counted upon.

A full list of the Special Advent Services has been printed, and need not be repeated here. I would earnestly invite members of the congregation and others to attend them with as great regularity as possible.

The Bishop of London has fixed Wednesday, March 8th, at 3.30 p.m., for the Confirmation. It is most likely that the Right Rev. A. F. Winnington Ingram, Bishop of Stepney, will officiate. Classes will be commenced early in January. Names of intending candidates should be given to me as early as possible.

I propose to give a short series of three Lectures on the Psalms during the month, to the members of the Diocesan Church Reading Union, in the Eastbank Mission Room, at 3.30 p.m., on Mondays, December 5th, 12th and 19th. The Lectures will deal with the origin and titles of the Psalms, and difficult and obscure words and expressions. The Lectures will be open to all.

The Thames Valley Fanciers' Association, of which Hampton Hill is the centre, will hold its Second Annual Show, in the Twickenham Town Hall, on Thursday, December 29th.
