MY DEAR FRIENDS,

As the accounts that follow are so lengthy my letter must be very brief this month.

It will be noticed that most of the funds are in a very satisfactory condition. The Curate's Fund, the Day Schools, the Nurse Fund and the Lads' Brigade are continually wanting new subscribers, as removals from our midst are frequently taking place, and I do not think that we are doing as much as we ought to be doing for Foreign Missions. I should very much like to see our subscription lists increased for this object. According to a request, several times expressed, I propose next month to publish a list of all the various objects for which subscriptions are required. The sum total of the receipts is certainly a large sum and very gratifying.

We are in great need of Sunday School Teachers. We have room for one or two permanent ones in both Schools, and we should also be very grateful for temporary help for a few weeks.

The fact that there has been a case of small-pox in the parish ought to have the effect of inducing every adult to be re-vaccinated as this is practically the only known safeguard against it.

The Annual Vestry Meeting took place on Thursday in Easter week, when there was a very good attendance. The accounts which will be found below were presented and adopted. I had again the pleasure of appointing Mr. Vine Griffiths as Vicar's Warden, and Mr. Storey was re-elected People's Warden.
