My DEAR FRIENDS,

It was impossible to print the whole of the Church accounts last month, the completion of them will be found below.

Our Annual Sunday School and Choir Excursion will take place on Friday the 6th inst., and it will be to Bonrnemouth. The Children will assemble at Fulwell Station at 6.30, and must place themselves under the care of their own teachers. The train for the return journey will leave Bournemouth Central Station at 6.10 p.m. The tea will take place at St. Swithin's Parish Room, East Cliff, at 4 p.m. Adult tickets for the journey 5/-, children under twelve 2/6. These may be obtained from the Rev. E S. Phillips, Miss Kidner and Mr. Golden, and also at Mr. Makepeace's. This will be a more costly excursion than we have hitherto had, but we hope that in view of the Coronation there will be a readiness on the part of those who kindly subscribe for the treats, to give a little more than usual. Miss Barnard is very kindly collecting subscriptions.

The two new bells have been fixed in the Church tower, but very little will be heard of them until the Coronation unless there should be a declaration of Peace in South Africa in which case they will help to spread the good news. There may, however, be some little practising beforehand. will be a short dedication of the bells, probably on on the eve of the Coronation.

On the Coronation day, Thursday, the 26th inst., there will be a choral service at 9.30 a.m., which will be identical with the service in Westminster Abbey, and there will also be a recital of the ceremonies to be there observed. The service will last about an hour. No doubt many who do not go up to see the procession on that day will like to be present.

The local festivities which are to take place on that day, at the Manor Park, are well known to everybody. Old and young alike are to have a thoroughly good time. A dinner for the veterans and a tea for the young, and games and fun for everybody will be the order of the day. rejoice that a wise and good king reigns over us, and we must not forget to thank God for all our national blessings, and to pray that our king and country may ever have divine guidance, blessing and protection.

On Sunday the 15th inst., members of the Girls' Friendly Society are earnestly invited to come to the Holy Communion at 8 a.m. Special prayers will then be offered for the Society.

On Sunday the 29th inst., St. Peter's Day, at 8 a.m., the offertory will be for the S.P.G., and prayers will be offered for Foreign Missions.
