MY DEAR FRIENDS,

Another Easter has come and gone. It used to be called the "Queen of Festivals," and in many respects it is the brightest and happiest of all the seasons. The Church looked as beautiful as ever with the quantities of flowers and plants and tasteful arrangements. The congregations were very large, the number of communicants being 465. May I take this opportunity of expressing my warmest thanks for the most kind and generous Easter offerings.

The Vestry Meeting was held on Thursday evening in Easter week, when there was a very good attendance. The Churchwardens presented the accounts for the year, which were adopted. Hearty votes of thanks were given to the Churchwardens and Sidesmen, and also to the members of the Voluntary Choir. I had again the pleasure of appointing Mr. Vine C. Griffiths as Vicar's Warden, and Mr. Storey was again unanimously elected People's Warden. The former Sidesmen were all re-appointed, and they are as follows:—Messrs. G. Evans, G. Dowsett, E. A.
