My DEAR FRIENDS,

Most of our organizations are now afloat for the Winter, and a fair start has been made with most of them. The Missionary Working party has begun with many new members. future the proceeds will be divided between the two great Missionary Societies, and it is proposed that instead of sending the work as hitherto, the articles made shall be sold, and the money sent. This will be further discussed and decided upon at the next meeting.

The Band of Hope has commenced with a large accession of members, and it is hoped that much good work will be done during the winter. The United Band of Hope Service at St. Alban's Church, on the 23rd inst., was very largely attended. The Sermon was preached by the Rev. E. S. Phillips.

Nurse Rixen, who has been with us for three years, has just resigned because she was about to be married. Many people who have had her assistance will remember her with gratitude, and all our good wishes will go with her in her married life. I am glad to say that the Committee have appointed Nurse Gertrude Smith to take the place of Nurse Rixen, and she comes with very strong recommendations.

The Annual Conversazione is fixed for Tuesday, the 7th inst., in the Victoria Hall. The doors will be open at 6.45 p.m. The Entertainment will be provided by the Westminster Pierrot Troupe. The tickets will be a shilling, and the proceeds will be given to the Curate's fund and the Treats' fund. I hope we may, as usual, have a thoroughly congregational gathering. Tickets may be obtained from the District Visitors, and Mr. Makepeace.

We had our first Men's Service for the season on Sunday, the 22nd inst., when about sixty men

were present. The next service will be on the 19th inst., at 3.30 p.m. The subject of the address will be "Imperishable Property."

There will be a Meeting of the Communicants' Guild on the 6th inst., when I hope to speak on the subject 'Why are prayers often not answered?'

Services for the G. F. S. and the Mothers' Union will be held during the month.

On Wednesday, the 29th, the eve of St. Andrew's Day, there will be special prayers for Foreign Missions at 8 p.m., and an Address on Missions.

The Bishop has asked us to invite all our lay helpers to come to the Holy Communion on Sunday, the 19th inst., that as workers we may join together in seeking God's special blessing at the same time that others, all over London, are doing the same thing. I would therefore warmly ask all our helpers to come at 8 o'clock on the 19th, i.e., Church Officers, Day and Sunday School Teachers, Choirmen, District Visitors, and all others who are engaged in any Church work. I hope all will come. I believe it will strengthen our work.

The next Meeting for prayer and study on Missionary work will be held in the Mission Room on the 16th inst., at 5.30 p.m.
