Papers giving particulars of the special Advent Services have been issued, and I earnestly invite you to make the fullest use of this solemn season, when we are reminded of the untold blessings of Christ's first coming, and the great responsibilities that rest upon us in view of a coming day of judgment. The Conversazione on the 7th ult. was on the whole very satisfactory. The entertainment by the "Westminster Pierrots," was most pleasing, and certainly the best I have seen of its kind. Upwards of 300 people were present. There was a small balance in hand after the payment of expenses, which was given to the Curate's fund.

The offertory of the Queen Victoria Clergy Fund, on All Saints' Day produced upwards of  $\pounds 8$ . In answer to the preacher's appeal for a volunteer to act as secretary for the fund, I am glad to say Mr. Dawkins offered himself, and he will be very glad to receive any contributions however small.

The painfully sudden death of Miss Florence Roe on the 6th ult. was a great shock to many of us. The day before she was worshipping with v in Church and apparently in perfect health. Miss Roe was formerly a district visitor, and in various ways a useful parish helper. She was well known and much esteemed. Our deepest sympathies are with her relatives. I am glad to say we are having very fair numbers at the men's services. The next will be on the 17th, and the subject of the address will be, "The power of to-morrow."

The attendance at the communicants guild is improving, but I wish we had a great many more. The next meeting will be on the 4th inst., and the subject will be "How did Jesus Christ pray?" At the service for the Mothers Union on the 15th ult. five new members were admitted, and the attendance was very good. I want to ask erch member to become a missionary and bring another. I am convinced that we have no better organization in the Church than this.

The Missionary Working party has had a considerable accession of members, and much work is being done. There is already an outcry for more materials, will anyone solve the difficulty?

A small group of people meet in the Eastbank Mission Room on alternate Thursdays at 5.30, for instruction and prayer for missions. The next meeting will be on Thursday, December 14th. I hope others will go.

The Temperance Society continues to admit new members, not so rapidly of course as we should like, but it is pushing its way. Saturday evening meetings will be held in the course of the month at the Westbank Mission Room, from 8 to 9, admission free.

The inspection of the Day Schools in Religious knowledge took place on the 22nd ult. The attendance of the children was very good, and the inspectors expressed themselves in most satisfactory, terms. The report will be printed as soon as it is received.
