MY DEAR FRIENDS,

It seems now a long time since the Harvest Festival, but I feel I must express my thanks to the many helpers who contributed to make the services a success: the members of the choir, and all who assisted at the decorations, and the many friends who so kindly sent plants, bread, fruit, corn and flowers. The contributors were too many to mention, but to each we are grateful. The attendances were very large and the offertories amounted to £19 14s. 4d.

On All Saints' Eve, October 31st, and All Saints' Day, November 1st, the offertories will be for the Queen Victoria Clergy Fund. This Fund exists for the purpose of assisting those Clergy whose incomes are very small. Very kind help was given last year, I hope there may be the same response this year.

Our Annual Conversazione is fixed for Tuesday, November 6th, at the Victoria Hall. Mr. Fredk. Chester and his sister-in-law have promised to come, and they are amongst the best entertainers for a purpose of this kind. The "Lend-a-Hand" Society, under the direction of Mr. Phillips, are also to lend-a-hand on this occasion, and they will do it well. The doors will open at 7 p.m., when tea will be handed round. This is always a pleasant social gathering. Any proceeds there may be will be for the Curate's Fund. Tickets may be had from the District Visitors and from Mr. Makepeace, Mr. Storey, junr., and Miss Allen.

The Nurse Fund Accounts will be found printed below. It will be seen that our reserve balance is now practically gone, and therefore that a larger measure of support will be needed to keep the fund going. The object is such an excellent one, and it is so fully appreciated, that I feel sure the necessary amount will be forthcoming. All contributions should be paid to Mrs. Stutchbury, Carnanton, Park road. The Nurse paid 304 visits during the last month, and her total visits for the past year were 3737.

I am requested to draw attention to a Meeting to be held in Exeter Hall, on Tuesday evening, November 27th, in connection with the Colonial and Continental Church Society, when the chief speaker will be Archdeacon Lloyd of Saskatchewan, who is well-known here, and who has a remarkable story to tell of Canada. There will also be cinematograph pictures illustrating the Colonies.

The Bishop of London has set apart Sunday, November 18th, for special prayer on behalf of all Church Workers in the Diocese of London. I would invite all our helpers to come to the Holy

Communion at 8 a.m. on that day, and let me ask all praying people to ask on that day for God's blessing upon all who are trying to do anything for the good of others in this parish and throughout the diocese.

The next meeting of the Communicants' Guild will be on Monday, November 5th.

Throughout the whole of Christendom there will be prayers for Foreign Missions at the end of the month. We shall have an intercession service on St. Andrew's Eve, Thursday, the 29th, and there will also be special prayers on St. Andrew's Day at the Holy Communion. I hope that those who are not able to be present will not forget the occasion.

The Temperance accounts which are printed below show a favourable balance in hand. The next meeting will be held on Tuesday, November 20th, when the speaker will be Mr. Wakefield Blenkhorn, from the central Society.
