The tickets will be 2/6 for the opening day till 6 o'clock, after 6 o'clock, 1/-; other days, 12 to 6, 1/-; after 6, 6d. I shall have some tickets which will admit at *half-price during the first four days*, and which may be obtained either at the Vicarage or from Miss Barnard.

St. James's Day, July 25th, will soon be here, and I am glad to say that the Lord Bishop of Kensington has very kindly promised to come and preach in the evening.
