My DEAR FRIENDS,

My monthly letter comes on this occasion in the midst of holiday times, when there is little going on in the parish, and when many are away at the sea-side or elsewhere, so my letter will be a short one.

The Choir had a very pleasant excursion to Margate on the 10th ult. We went by boat from London Bridge, and spent nearly the whole of a brilliant day on the water. I believe everybody who went thoroughly enjoyed it. The Choir give up a great deal of time ungrudgingly in attending the practices, and we are most grateful to them. The Annual Outing is a very slight recognition of their services. It is a way by which we say "thank you" to them for all they do in assisting in the Church.

· Most sad deaths have taken place within the last few days of two who have been connected with the Church. Mrs. Conrad Hanrott, who was well known as Miss Edith Foster, and whose father was so recently and so unexpectedly called away, has now herself gone to her rest. Her illness was very short and the end most unlooked for. She had been married scarcely a year. Very real sorrow is felt for the two families so suddenly involved in grief. A few days earlier, Mr. Martin, of Hanworth Road, members of whose family have for many years been most valuable helpers in the parish, passed away after a severe illness.

With his devoted widow and children, all who know them will feel the deepest possible sympathy. For all immediately affected in these two cases we would say, may God help and comfort them in their deep sorrow.

It will be noticed that an improvement has been effected in the Lichgate entrance to the churchyard. Panels have been fixed in the sides, and in addition to a list of services, etc., a few short sentences have been inscribed suggestive of the sacred nature of the churchyard, and asking all who enter to treat it with reverence. I hope all will make a point of reading the inscriptions.

The Harvest Festival is fixed for Tuesday, the 29th inst. (St. Michael and All Angels' Day). There will be Celebrations of the Holy Communion at 7.30 and 11 a.m. An Address will be given at the second service by a Missionary, and the offertory will be for the Church Missionary Society. In the Evening at 8 p.m. there will be a Choral Service, when the preacher will be the Rev. H. E. Hall, Vicar of St. Peter's, Staines, who has already been twice to the parish, and whose eloquence is well known. Gifts of corn, fruit, bread and flowers will be thankfully received early on the 28th. The harvest has, I believe, been one of the best we have had for many years, and we ought to be ready to show our thankfulness for it.
