My DEAR FRIENDS,

Most of our Organizations have opened during the month for the Winter's work. The Band of Hope has made a good beginning; the Temperance Society has secured Mr. Jordan as Secretary, and has opened well; the Missionary Working Party has several new members, and will be glad to welcome more; the Lads' Brigade has received valuable support from several new subscribers, and seems likely to have a good season; the Musical Society, under the Conductorship of Mr. Phillips, has received a large accession of members; and the Evening Continuation School has made a good start.

Below will be found a list of contributions to the cost of erecting the new Parish Room. The total expense, apart from a sum most kindly defrayed by Mrs. FitzWygram, in addition to the gift of the Room, is £41 8s. 3d., so it will be seen that about £21 is yet required, and I should like to ask members of the congregation, who have not yet subscribed, if they would most kindly help in providing this sum. Mr. Vine Griffiths, of Gwynant Villa, is the treasurer, and any sums will be very thankfully received by him or by myself as early as may be convenient. The Room is very comfortable and is already found to be of great use.

The Rescue and Preventive Society for the Hamptons, Teddington and District, is doing very important work, but is crippled for want of funds. An additional £100 is required for the current year, and every parish in the neighbourhood is asked by the Council to

increase its support. In Hampton Hill the collectors are Mrs. Swain, Mrs. Tidey and Mrs. Barton, who will be very glad to receive any help, however small.

The Day School Inspection in Religious Knowledge is fixed for Friday, the 6th inst.

The Annual Conversazione is to take place on Thursday, the 19th inst., at the Victoria Hall. The doors will be open at 7 p.m. I am glad to say that I have secured the services of an old favourite in the person of Mr. Frederick Chester, who will be accompanied by his sister-in-law, Miss Hummel. We shall also have the assistance of some good local talent. Tickets may be had from the District Visitors and at Mr. Makepeace's.

There will be a Service for the Girls' Friendly Society Members on Thursday, the 12th inst., at 4.15 p.m.; and also one for the Members of the Mothers' Union on Tuesday, the 17th inst., at 3 p.m.

There will be a Temperance Meeting in the Boy's Schoolroom, on Friday, the 13th inst., where there will be a discussion on the Licensing Bill.

We may expect that the coming Winter will bring a good deal of hardship, and I shall be most grateful for generous support for our Sick and Poor Fund. May I ask for increased offertories at the Early Communions, which are for this Fund, and also for any special donations? I shall also be grateful for any gifts of old clothing, and especially of boots.
