Boys. Each Division as a whole. 1st—Excellent. 2nd—Excellent. 3rd—Excellent. 4th—Excellent.

"The School is again excellent in each division. Div. I. is earnestly and effectively taught: there was general and thoughtful answering on Holy Scripture, and interesting teaching has been given on the History of the Church of England. The Catechism explanation should be more definite in parts. Division II. is well and brightly taught throughout. In Div. III the New Testament subjects show study and a good grasp of the practical bearing of the lessons, and manifest pains have been taken with the rest of the work. Div. IV. is taught with ability and marked success: the answering was accurate and eager and well distributed over the class."
