MY DEAR FRIENDS,

The CHORAL SOCIETY'S performance of Mendelssohn's "St. Paul" is to take place in the Boys' School, on Thursday, the 6th inst., at 8 p.m. The greatest pains have been taken with this, and the result is sure to be very pleasing. The prices for admission are very low, and the room ought to be quite full.

It is, I think, generally known that Mr. Dawkins has resigned the post of Organist of St. James's Church, which he has held for about thirty-four years. I do not suppose that there are many men who have filled such a position at one Church for so long. Mr. Dawkins does not actually relinquish his post until the end of June. There will of course be other opportunities of speaking of his services. I take this opportunity of informing the congregation that Mr. H. T. Gilberthorpe, F.R. C.O., and L. Mus. T. C.L., has been appointed to succeed Mr. Dawkins. Mr. Gilberthorpe has been trained by Dr. Bates. Organist of Norwich Cathedral, and has had considerable experience. His testimonials are of the highest order. He has been selected with very great care out of about sixty applicants. In the selection we have the advantage of the best musical advice. Mr. Gilberthorpe will reside in the parish, and will be prepared to make arrangements for music lessons with any who may desire it.

On GOOD FRIDAY the Services will be as usual. There will be Service and Sermon at 11 a.m. Meditations from 2 to 3 p.m., corresponding with the Saviour's last hour on the Cross. Evening Service and Sermon at 7 p.m., when the address will be given by the Rev. Ramsdale Gidney, the Vicar of Shepperton. The offertories will be given for the local Society for Rescue and Preventive Work.

On Thursday night in Holy Week at 8 p.m., there will be a Service of Preparation for the Easter Communion.

On EASTER DAY there will be Celebrations of the Holy Communion, 6, 7, 8 a.m., and at midday. Communicants are asked to very kindly observe that it is a great convenience to me if they will write their names and addresses on slips of paper and place them in a basket provided for the purpose in the Church porch. May I remind you that all Church people are

invited to the Holy Communion on Easter Day. Flowers and plants for the decorations will be thankfully received on Saturday, the 15th, as early as convenient. We shall be very grateful if the usual helpers will again give us their kind assistance.

On Tuesday the 18th inst., there will be a TEMPERANCE MEETING, to which the public are invited, in the Boys' School at 8 p.m. The address will be given by Madame Norkus.

The VESTRY MEETING will be held on one of the evenings in Easter week. I hope we may have a good attendance. I regret to say that, after twelve years of most valuable service as Churchwarden, Mr. Vine Griffiths feels he must relinquish that office.
