I am sure you will all sympathize with the Misses Hayes in the loss they have sustained by the death of their sister, Miss Mary Hayes, after a very long illness. The funeral took place amid many tokens of respect, on Tuesday, 26th October.

We are still requiring additional Teachers for the Sunday Schools. At a recent Meeting it was decided to hold a Teachers' Meeting every Wednesday, at 7 p.m., in the Church Room, when I hope to "go through" the lessons for the following Sunday. In this way the teaching throughout the Schools will be consolidated. It is with great regret that I record the loss to the Girls' School occasioned by the resignation of Miss Dorothy Fox. Miss Fox has left to do Hospital training, and her position as Superintendent will be hard to fill: meanwhile she carries our good wishes and prayers for her in her future work. Perhaps when the war is over we may welcome her back again!

The Annual Sale on behalf of the Missions of the Church will take place in the Vicarage on Wednesday, December 1st, from 3 till 6.30. May I bespeak your generous support?

PARISH ORGANIZATIONS.

The Congregation are particularly asked to support the following organizations according to their means; Assistant Clergy *£120 (apart from Vicar's contribution); Churchyard, *£25; Sunday Schools, *£10; Day Schools (Building maintenance and repairs), *£10; Provident Club, *£10; Church Lads' Brigade, *£10; Treats' Fund, *£20. Contributions may be sent to the Churchwardens, to whose order cheques should be made payable.

**Required annually.*

Support is also asked for the Freewill Offering Scheme (weekly, monthly, quarterly, or annual contributions), under which the parish contributes to (1) the following diocesan funds instead of having separate appeals and collections in church, viz:— (a) Training for the Ministry; (b) Maintenance of the Ministry in poorer districts of the diocese; (c) Pensions for Clergy; (d) Clergy Widows and Orphans; (e) Church buildings and repairs in poorer districts of the diocese; (f) Religious Education of the young in poor districts of the diocese; (g) Organization and general purposes (not to exceed 6d. out of every sovereign contributed, or one fortieth part), and (2) in the surplus, if any, of each year, which ends 31st December, those parochial funds, specially needing help. Hon. Secretary of Scheme: Mr. A. F. Poley, Willowbank, Uxbridge Road, who will supply envelopes for weekly contributions, on request.

The Vicar will be glad if those who desire to see him on parochial matters will call at the Vicarage any morning between 9 and 9.30. Papers can always be signed in the Vestry by one of the Clergy before or after any week-day service.
