MY DEAR PEOPLE,

Another Lent is drawing near with its call to Prayer and effort. These seasons of the Church come with additional solemnity at this sad time, and I hope we shall use the opportunity for deepening our spiritual life, and thus taking our share in the awakening of the Nation to higher ideals.

The various arrangements for Lent will be issued in due course. I may mention here that I hope to continue the course of sermons on the "Gospels" on Sunday Evenings, and to preach on "Christ the Giver of Peace" on Wednesdays. There will also be an address at the mid-day Service on Fridays.

In common with most parishes in this Deanery the last Friday in the month was observed as a day of Intercession on behalf of the War, and I was glad to see that each interval had its "Intercessor." The next day will be Friday, March 24th. A paper will be placed in the Church Porch for names to be entered.

Mr. A. F. E. Poley having joined His Majesty's Forces, his sister—Miss Poley—has very kindly undertaken the work so well done by her brother in connection with the Free-will Offering Scheme. Applications for envelopes, &c, should therefore be made to Miss Poley, Willowbrook, Uxbridge Road.

Classes are being held for Confirmation as follows:—Girls—Wednesdays at 4.30, Fridays at 8. Boys—Fridays at 8.30, and Saturdays at 6. The Service will take place at Hampton Wick on Monday, March 27th, at 8 p.m.

The Rev. Vibert Jackson, of S.S. Michael and George, Fulwell, has kindly promised to speak at our C.E.M.S. Meeting on March 21st. His subject is "Church Work in India." The speaker will give us first hand knowledge, and I trust a good number will be present.

At the 12 (noon) Service on Ash Wednesday a Sermon will be preached and collections made on behalf of the Colonial and Continental Church Society. Preacher:—Rev. G. W. Crawford, of Brussels.

I hope to preach the usual monthly sermon on the "War" at 11 a.m., March 5th.
