Much sympathy is felt for Mrs. Kiddell who has lost her son, George Bertram Pearce Kiddell, in the war ; also with the relatives of others whose names appear for the first time in our "Roll of Honour."

The Easter Vestry will be held in the Church Room on Thursday, April 12th, at 8 p.m. I hope that we shall have a good attendance.

"Summer Time" will be inaugurated on the night of April 7th, and on April 8th the evening Service will commence at 7 instead of 6 p.m.

The Parish sadly needs two or three new District Visitors ; will those who are able and willing to devote 3 or 4 hours a week to this very important and useful work kindly communicate with me ?

The Churchwardens will be glad if all subscriptions to the various parochial funds can be paid to them as soon as possible. I understand that the Churchyard Fund needs very considerable additional support in order that the present excellent condition of "God's Acre" may be maintained ; a small sum given annually by those who have loved ones resting there will be ample to meet the need.

The annual cleaning of the walls, &c., of the interior of the Church will take place in the week beginning April 16th : there will, in consequence, be no week-day services during that time.
