A comprehensive scheme, on the lines of the Diocesan Board of Finance, was accepted, particulars of which will be published later.

WOMEN PATROLS.—From May to September, 1917, women patrols, wearing the armlet of the National Union of Women Workers, and furnished with permits from the Office of Works, were working in couples in Bushy Park and, during the later part of the time, in Hampton Court Home Park. These workers were welcomed by the Superintendents of the Parks, under whose general direction they work. Most of them were busy women, who could only give one evening a week to the work, which meant that the work could only be adequately done by recruiting and training a large number of patrols. The Teddington and Hamptons' Patrols' Committee is now recruiting for the coming season, May to September, and would welcome applications from ladies between the ages of 25 and 50 who could give an evening a week to work which is of benefit to the whole district.
