MY DEAR PEOPLE,

We all sympathise very much with Mr. Churchwarden Evans in the loss sustained by him through the death, after a brief illness, of his only brother, the Rev. Arnold Evans, Rector of Neath, S. Wales, whose work for the Church was well known, not only in Wales but also in England.

To Mr. Churchwarden Carpenter our hearty congratulations are given on his reception from His Majesty the King, of the O.B.E. (Officer of the British Empire). This honour has been conferred in recognition of the voluntary work Mr. Carpenter has undertaken in connection with the War.

A very important Meeting of the Parochial Finance Committee took place on Tuesday, June 25th, there were fifteen members present. Mr. Evans laid before the Meeting a financial statement from which it appeared that it is essential for the due maintenance of the Church and its services, that £8 per Sunday should be contributed towards the "Church Expense" Fund, during the next quarter. This means just doubling the sum at present received. I hope you will respond generously to this appeal.

As a measure of economy it was decided to discontinue the use of the Mission Room in Cross Street for parochial purposes, as it was felt that, until our new Parish Hall is built, the Church Room in St. James's Road met all requirements.

Mr. Poley reported on the Free-Will Offering Scheme, and a hope was expressed that a more wide-spread advantage should be taken of this method of helping the work of the Church.

The following, as representing various parochial funds, were co-opted on the Committee: Miss Brewer (S.P.G.), Mrs. Joseph (C.C.C.S.), Mrs. Kestin (Mothers' Union), Mrs. Kiddell (C.M.S.), and Miss Ward (Magazine).

Miss Brewer is to be congratulated on the great success of the Church Army Flag Day, which resulted in £65 being sent to Head Quarters.

The children at the Sunday School will have their Annual Outing on July 30th, going again to Windsor. Donations towards the Treats' Fund may be sent to me or to any Sunday School teacher.

In the Boys' Sunday School Mr. Daines has felt obliged, by pressure of other duties, to resign his position as Superintendent. His resignation was accepted with regret. Mr. W. Jordan has consented to act in his place. Mr. Daines still continues his duties as Treasurer.

There will be no week-day Services from July 15th to July 20th. The All-Day Intercession for the War will take place on Friday, July 26th.

The Sermons on July 14th will be specially for the Children.
