MY DEAR PEOPLE,

By command of the King, and with the hearty commendation of the Church, August 4th will be observed in the Parish as a day of Special Intercession on behalf of the War, and of Thanksgiving for the courage and endurance of the Nation during these four years of great anxiety and stress. Special Forms of Service will be used, and I hope every Parishioner will join in Prayer for the speedy termination, by a just and honourable Peace, of this world-wide tragedy of the human race.

It was, I am sure, a great pleasure to us all, having with us again Mr. Phillips, who came up from Devon for the Service of Dedication of the War Shrine presented by Miss Brewer to the memory of her brother—killed in Battle. The names of all those connected with the Church and Parish who have made the Great Sacrifice appear on the Shrine, and I trust it will be a perpetual reminder to us all of how much we owe to them, and draw from us a prayer not only for them, but for ourselves that "we may follow in their train."

To Mr. Jakeman and the members of his family we offer our sincere sympathy in their loss by the death, after a long illness most patiently borne, of Mrs. Jakeman, a very constant and devout worshipper at S. James's.

I am glad to say that in response to the appeal made last month there has been an improvement in the Offertories for Church Expenses. They do not yet reach £8 per Sunday, but if everyone adds a little more to that usually given there need be no further anxiety for the Finance Committee to face.

I hope to resume the Sermons on the Epistle of S. Peter on Wednesday, July 31st, at 8 p.m.

There will be no Morning Sunday School during August, and the Teachers' Meeting will, in consequence, not be held.

The next 'All-Day Intercession for the War' will take place on Friday, August 23rd, and the District Visitors will meet on the 30th, at 11.15 a.m. in the Vestry.
