We were favoured with beautiful weather for the Sunday School Excursion to Windsor, on July 30th, and the day was much enjoyed. I am indebted to Miss Lush and Mr. Jordan for their great help on these occasions.

The Infants were not so favoured on August 17th, when, instead of a gathering in the Vicarage Field, we had to meet in the Boys' School, where a very pleasant afternoon was spent, the arrangements being in the capable hands of Miss Jordan with the help of Mrs. Gamgee and other willing helpers.

The All-Day Intercession on behalf of the War will take place on Friday, September 27th.

It seems necessary to remind ourselves that when the proper time comes we shall have our own permanent War Memorial in our own village to our own heroes. Already a very considerable sum has been guaranteed, though no general

appeal has been made to the Parish—that will come later.

The Members of the Mothers' Union had their Quarterly Service in Church, on Friday, August 2nd. Tea was afterwards served in the Boys' School, and a delightful Entertainment given by the Hampton Girl Guides through the kindness of Miss K. Kiddell.
