MY DEAR PEOPLE,

The most important social function this month is the Annual Fête. We have this year increased the number of stalls, hoping by this means to give ample scope for all to empty their purses. Of course we are in the hands of the weather, but, granted a fine day, we aim at making this event a record success financially. All we ask is for your usual kind patronage. Through the kind help of Mrs. Norton we have been fortunate in securing Lady Vernon to open the Fête. We shall be grateful for gifts wherewith to furnish the various stalls; they should be sent to the Vicarage on or before Monday, June 13th.

The Confirmation is fixed for Monday, June 27th, at our own Church this year. The service will begin at eight o'clock in the evening. I ask your earnest prayers for the candidates.

Our Parish News tells us of the work of various bodies in the parish for Home and Overseas Missions. The workers are all to be congratulated on having by their efforts and through the generous support of kind friends raised such excellent amounts for the various causes in which they are interested. There are a few in the parish who grudge the Missionary Societies the comparatively small amount we send them. If only they would

join our Missionary Association, or even make a regular study of the work of the Church Overseas by borrowing books from our Lending Library, I believe they would soon become ardent supporters of the work, which, by virtue of the commission given to her by her Master, is the Church's chief concern. I often wonder whether those who think that we give too much money to outside objects adequately support parochial funds themselves.

We have fixed the Sunday School Treat for July 19th. This year we are taking the children to Worthing by char-a-banc. I should be glad to receive donations towards this annual visit of our youngsters to the sea as soon as possible.

The Day School Empire Day Celebration was a very interesting and enjoyable event. In song and recitation, play and tableaux, the history of the building up of the Empire and the highest ideals of Empire were brought home to all present. The children did their parts admirably, and great praise is due to the teachers for the excellent training of the children.
