MY DEAR PEOPLE,

The Confirmation is in our Church this year. I do hope that on July 16th there will be a large congregation of people who by their presence and prayers will give support and encouragement to the Candidates as they enter upon their life of dedicated Service to God, endued with the Power of the Holy Spirit. May it be a gathering of people whose own day of Confirmation is brought vividly to their memory and who, being conscious of some back-sliding since that day will resolve to make a renewal of spiritual endeavour and to give much practical assistance to the young Soldiers of Christ, who in these days need all the help we older servants of The Master can give them.

It is my earnest desire that we should make much more of our Patronal Festival, not from a social point of view but rather on its spiritual side. To this end I have set out under the Parish News a list of services for the Octave in the hope that all who love their Church will make a real and concentrated effort to be present at all or most of the services. The Sunday School Outing will come in the Octave and I shall be grateful for the usual financial support from the many kind friends who always help to give the children an enjoyable day at the sea.

This month our fate hangs more upon the weather than at any time in the year. Given a fine day on July 9th, our hopes of adding another two hundred pounds to our Parish Hall Fund may

possibly be realised.
