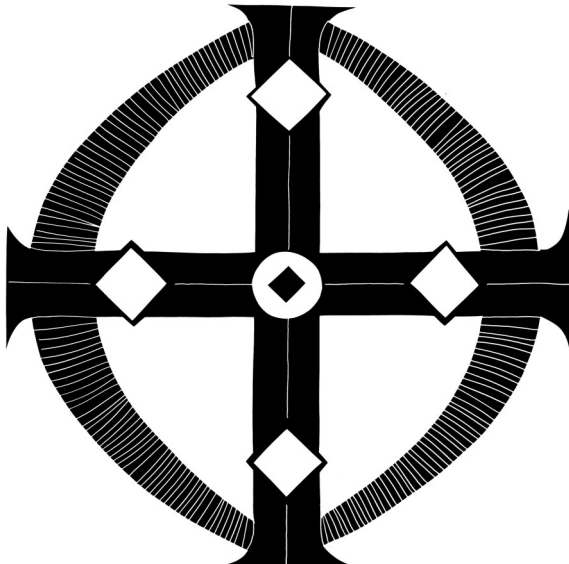

A minister uses these or other suitable words

and to live in love and peace with all.

All Almighty God, our heavenly Father,
we have sinned against you
and against our neighbour

We are truly sorry
and repent of all our sins.
For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ,
who died for us,
forgive us all that is past,

Father, you made the world

Do this, as often as you drink it,
 in remembrance of me.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did,
in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice
made once for all upon the cross.

Bringing before you the bread of life
and cup of salvation,
we proclaim his death and resurrection
until he comes in glory.

The president and people receive communion. Please come forward, as invited, to receive communion. If you are a visitor and have been baptised you are very welcome to take communion with us here. If you do not receive communion then we invite you to come for a blessing.

Prayer after Communion

Silence is kept.

The Post Communion or another prayer is said.

All **Almighty God,**
we thank you for feeding us
with the body and blood
of your Son Jesus Christ.
Through him we offer you
our souls and bodies
to be a living sacrifice.
Send us out in the power of your Spirit
to live and work to your praise and glory.
Amen.

All **Father of all,**
We give you thanks and praise,
that when we were still far off
you met us in your Son
and brought us home.
Dying and living, he declared your love,
gave us grace,
and opened the gate of glory.
May we who share Christ's body
live his risen life;
we who drink his cup bring life to others;
we whom the Spirit lights
give light to the world.
Keep us firm in the hope
you have set before us,
so we and all your children shall be free,
and the whole earth live to praise your name;
through Christ our Lord.
Amen.
