


Common Worship Holy Communion

A minister uses these or other suitable words

We are truly sorry and repent of all our sins. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, who died for us, forgive us all that is past, and grant that we may serve you in newness of life to the glory of your name. Amen.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated

at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

The president introduces the Peace with a suitable sentence and then says

The peace of the Lord be always with you and also with you.

The deacon says

Let us offer one another a sign of peace

All exchange a sign of peace.

Preparation of the Table Taking of the Bread and Wine

The gifts of the people are gathered and presented.

Yours Lord in the greatness, the power the glory, the splendour and the majesty;

All things come from you, and of your own do we give you.

The table is prepared and bread and wine are placed upon it. The president takes the bread and wine.

The Eucharistic Prayer

- All His Spirit is with us.

All It is right to give thanks and praise.

Here follows an extended Preface or the following

We praise and bless you, loving Father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us

the body and blood of your dear Son.

On the night before he died
he had supper with his friends
and, taking bread, he praised you.
He broke the bread, gave it to them and said:
Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you;
do this in remembrance of me.

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine.

Again he praised you, gave it to them and said: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.

Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross.

Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory. Christ has died: Christ is risen: Christ will come again.

> Lord of all life, help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth.

Look with favour on your people, gather us in your loving arms and bring us with James and all the saints to feast at your table in heaven.

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever.






2 Lift up your hearts - Sursum Corda
